WHAT IS THE JESUIT SPIRITUAL CENTER AT MILFORD?

The Jesuit Spiritual Center at Milford (JSC), an apostolate of the Chicago Province of the Society of Jesus, is located in Milford Ohio, fifteen miles east of Cincinnati. The center is located on 35 acres, surrounded by trees and the scenic Little Miami River.

WHAT IS THE NEXT INTERNSHIP?

The NEXT Internship program's focus is on youth retreats, but it also provides interns with skills and experience applicable to wider areas of ministry. Since the Internship's beginning in 1975, more than 120 people of different backgrounds have completed the program including men, women, seminarians and religious. Graduates have gone on to work as youth ministers, DRE's, campus ministers, educators, teachers, social workers, counselors, and spiritual directors.

The internship involves full-time membership on the Youth Ministry Team, working in retreat ministry, primarily with high school and junior high students. During the 10-month program, interns will facilitate approximately 30 overnight retreats and 25 one-day retreats or DORs (Days of Reflection). In addition, the intern will serve as part of the overall team of staff at the JSC and enjoy the company of those who fill a variety of other positions at the Center.

This year, the JSC is adding a residential component to the internship, allowing individuals from across the country to participate. Interns live on the grounds of the Center in an intentional faith community, overseen by a Community Life Coordinator. Community members share not only in their ministerial work, but meals, prayer, and fellowship.

WHAT CAN I GAIN FROM THE INTERNSHIP?

Interns receive hands-on training in youth ministry within the context of a retreat setting. Interns have the opportunity to develop a variety of skills, including: faith sharing; small and large group facilitation; active listening; public speaking; story-telling; leading prayer experiences; leading group initiatives; leading praise & worship music; and event coordination. Interns will receive constructive feedback on their performance of these skills and will have many opportunities to practice them.

Each intern will work closely with a mentor who will assist in personal and professional development. The youth ministry intern receives training at the beginning of the internship in areas of: group dynamics and facilitation, leadership, public speaking, communication, active listening, and adolescent development. The youth retreat team meets regularly for support, personal sharing, prayer, and socialization. The meetings may cover topics from spirituality to team dynamics. Participants often report a great deal of personal and spiritual growth during the internship.

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE PRACTICAL DETAILS OF THE INTERNSHIP?

The internship runs from August 2017 until May, 2018 (exact start/end dates to be announced). Interns live together in an Intentional Faith community for the duration of the Internship. Housing is located on the grounds of the JSC. In addition to free housing, Interns share a monthly stipend for meals, as well as a smaller individual stipend to cover various personally expenses.

II. PRIMARY FUNCTION OF THIS POSITION

NEXT Interns are responsible for assisting with developing and facilitating youth retreats.

III. POSITION CONTENT

A. MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES AND REGULAR ACTIVITIES

1. Assist with day-to-day operations of the youth ministry program
2. Plan and prepare retreats and programs with the Youth Team
3. Learn all parts of the retreats to eventually facilitate different sessions
4. Lead small groups on overnight retreats
5. Interact professionally with campus ministers, teachers, pastoral associates, and principals
6. Have regular one-on-one meetings with the Directors to check in and receive feedback

B. LEARNING GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

1. Interns will be able to share the value of faith with youth, educating and transforming them through active witness to the Gospel values.
2. Interns will learn and develop effective skills in group facilitation, public speaking, lesson planning, and utilizing technology, music & media in ministry.
3. Interns will participate in and contribute to the daily prayer life of the Youth Team that will form and inform their praxis as ministers and aspiring professionals.
